All students competed in just about every event winning heaps of ribbons.

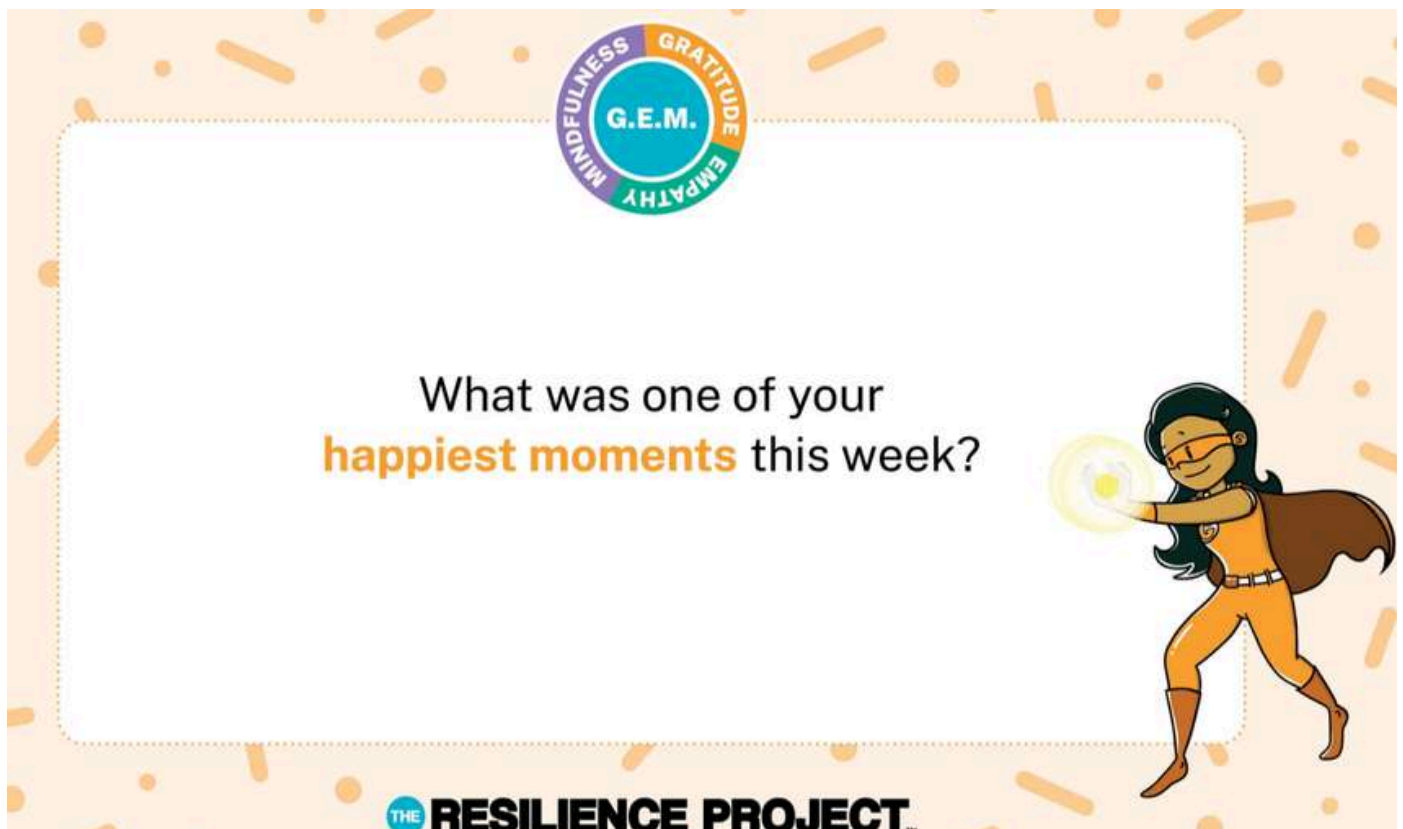

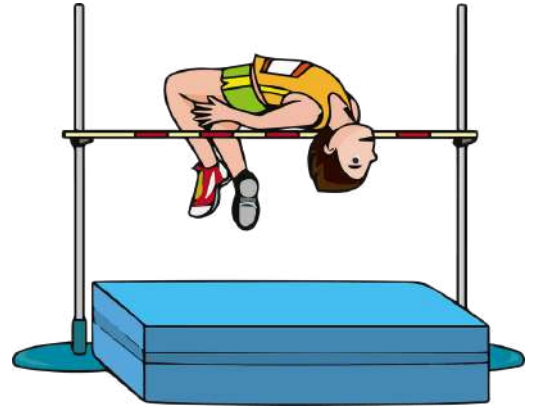

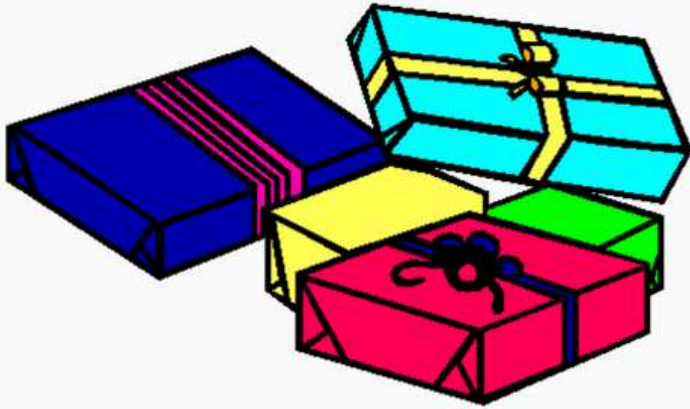

WHOLE SCHOOL MATHS LEARNING!

Our whole school learning this week has focused on Algebra:



There are twenty gifts stacked up into four piles.

The first pile has 3 less than the second pile.

The second pile has two more than the third pile.

The fourth pile has twice as many as the second pile.

How many gifts are in each pile?

The students used a model and were able to quickly work out the solution.

Some of the students have written their own set of clues. Have a go at home:

There are 30 blocks in total in 3 piles.
There are 3 more blocks in the second pile than the first pile.
The last pile has double the first pile.
