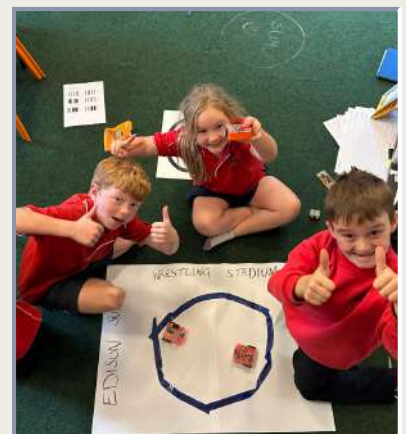
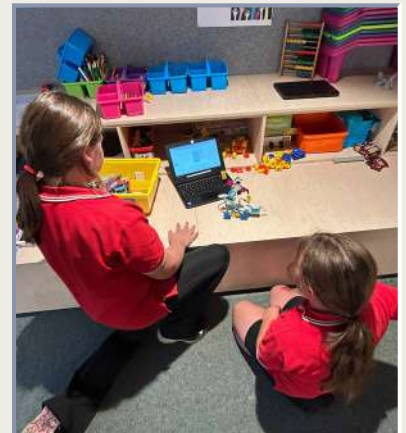
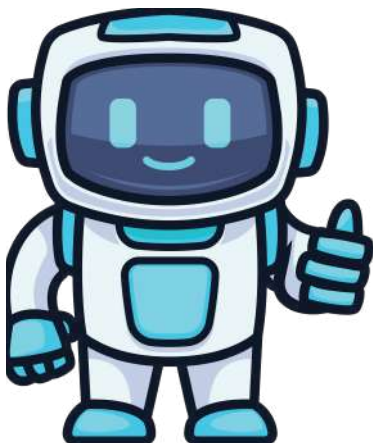
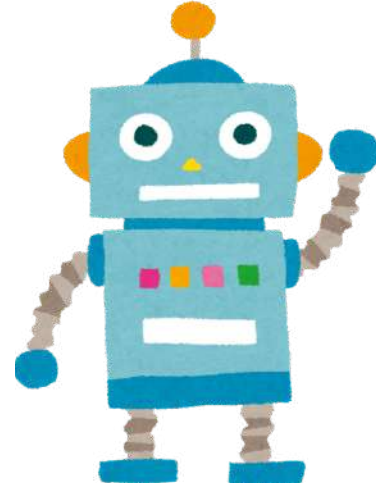
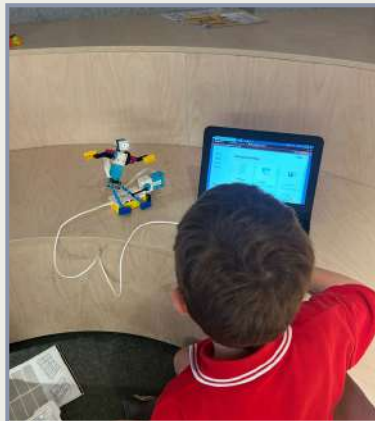


Can you solve this viral maths problem?

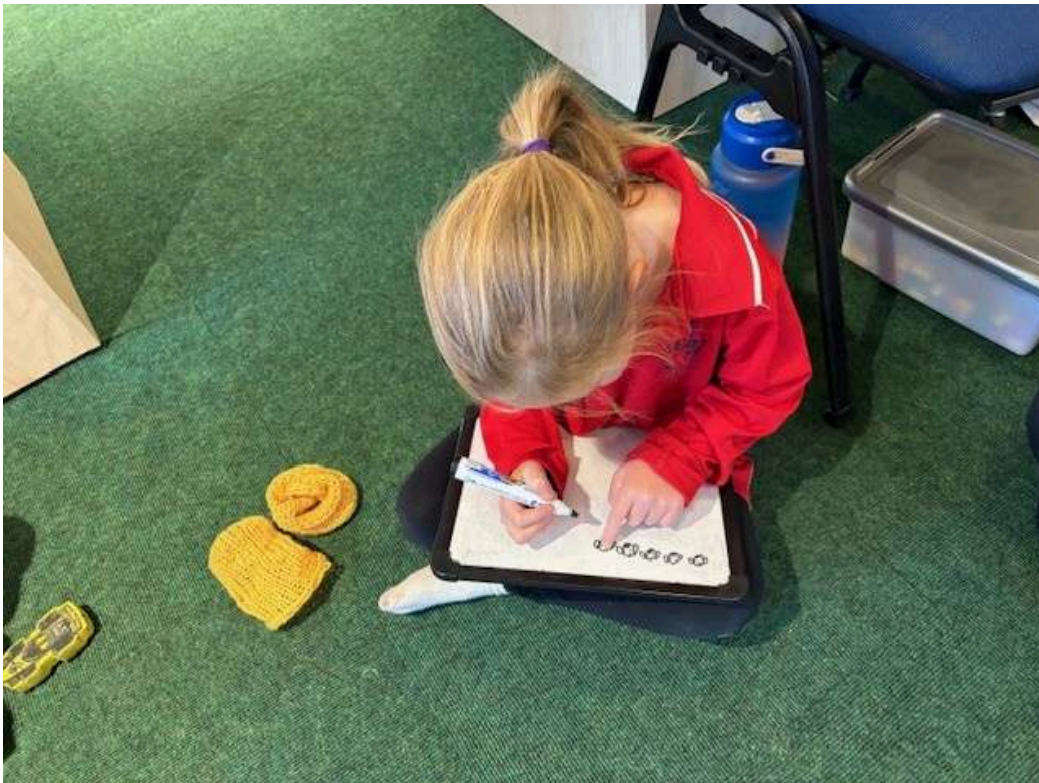

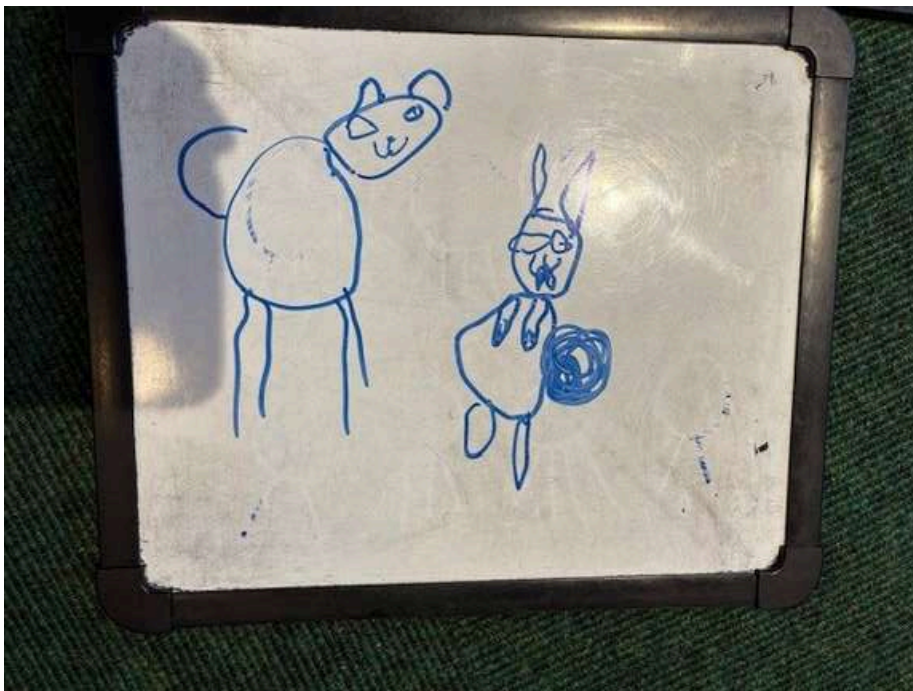
Junior maths
