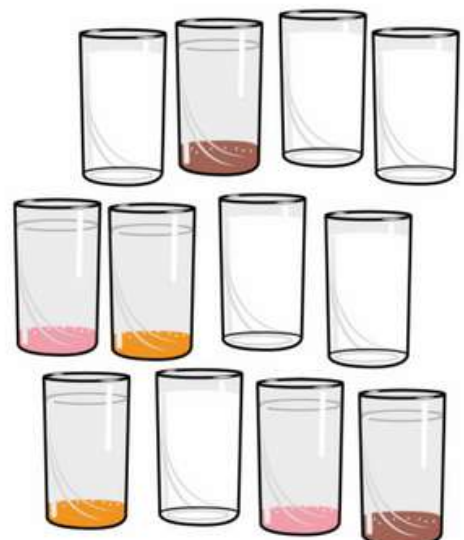
Problem of the Week #2 Party Cleanup

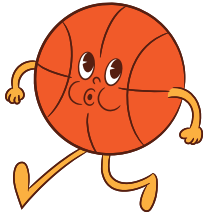
After a party there were some glasses to wash.

- When they were arranged in **sevens** there were **none** left over.

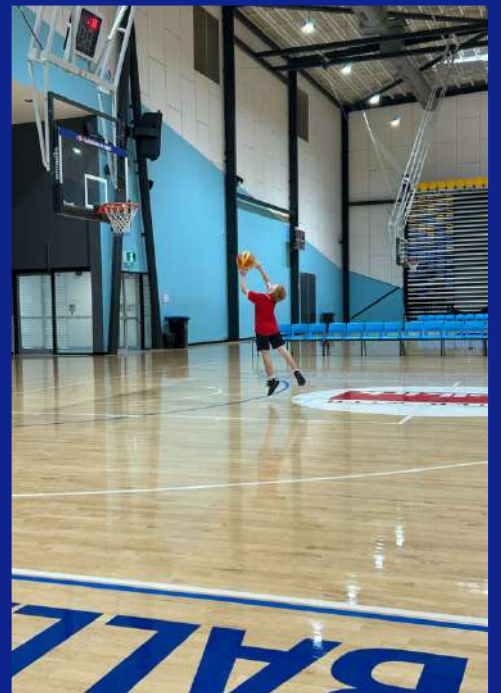

Homelessness Week 4th - 10th of August 2025

We are raising awareness about homelessness this week, including a can drive to be donated to a local Emergency Relief program by hosting a casual clothes day.

What is homelessness?

Homelessness is far more than “rooflessness”. Homelessness means being without a secure stable and private space to live.

Most people without a home live in temporary, insecure, or unsafe housing situations such as rooming houses, cars, or government-funded crisis accommodation. Other people live in severely overcrowded accommodation or are couch surfing with family or friends; this is often called “hidden homelessness” because, while more common than rough sleeping, it typically goes unnoticed.

The causes of homelessness are often misunderstood. A chronic shortage of social housing, an increasingly unaffordable private rental market, and inadequate income support means that thousands of Australians struggle to find a secure and affordable place to live.

The top three reasons for people seeking homelessness services in Victoria are:

- financial difficulties (46%)
- family and domestic violence (44%)
- housing crisis (34%)

At the last Census, 30,660 Victorians were without a home.

In 2021–22, Victorian homelessness services assisted 102,000 people.

25% of Victorians without a home are young people between 12 and 24 years.

What is needed to end homelessness?

To end homelessness once it occurs people need:

- Adequate incomes
- A home
- To be free from violence and abuse
- Effective support to gain and retain housing
