Camps, Sports, Excursion Fund (CSEF)

Hi all,

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school excursions, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or support an out of home care student you may be eligible for CSEF.

If you applied for CSEF at our school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments:
your child has started or changed schools this year
- changed family circumstances:
such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year

Please check with me if you are unsure

CSEF has increased to \$400 for 2026.

The Linton takeaway participated in this fundraiser as well and together we raised \$ 121.20 towards “Do it for Dolly” charity.

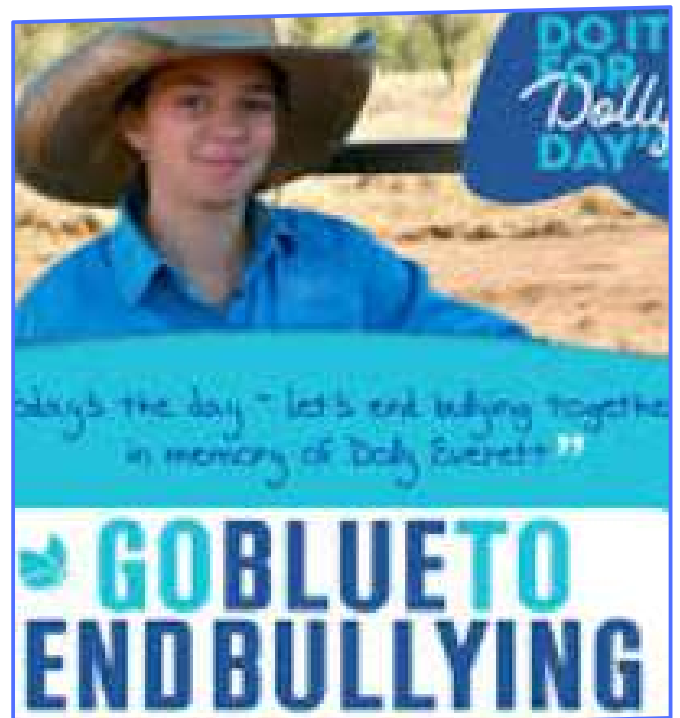
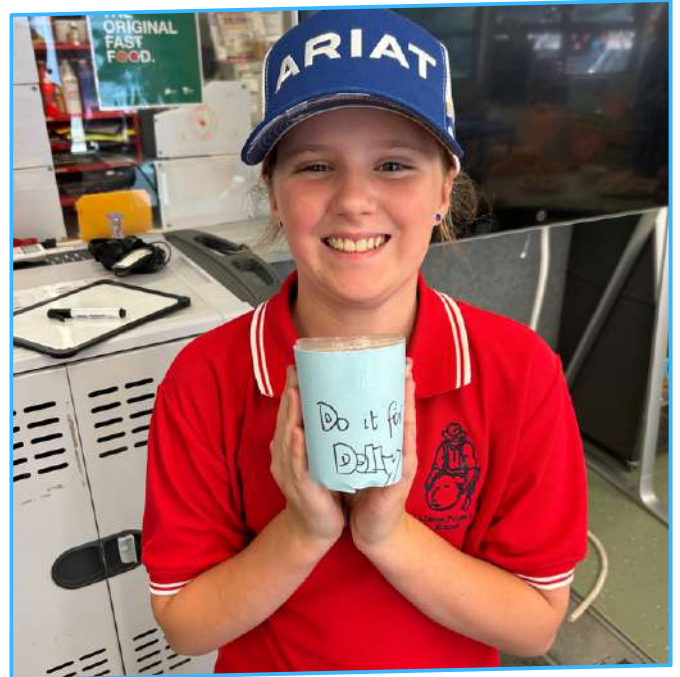

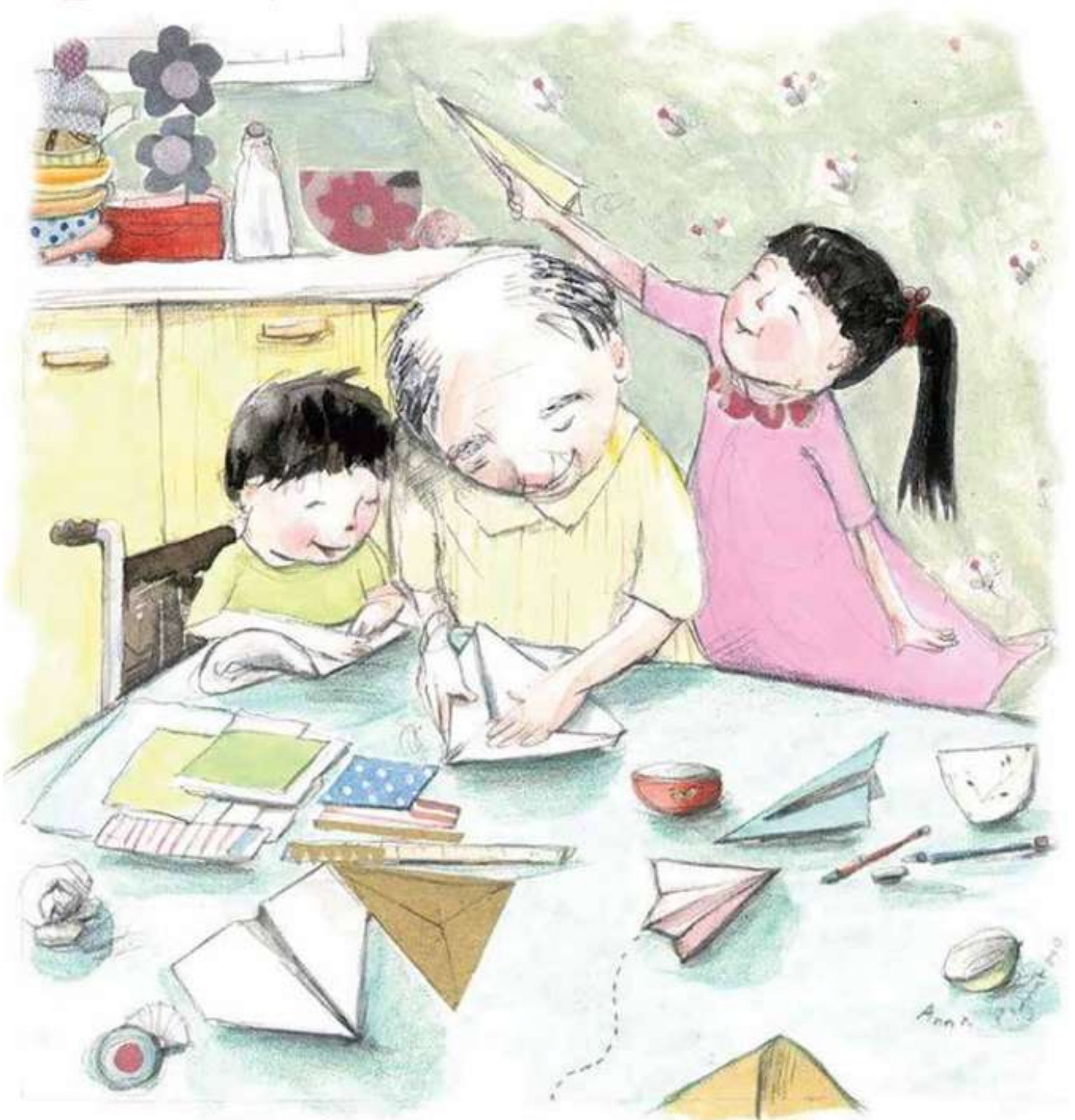
