
If you require to collect a child early or drop off a little later due to (for example) a medical appointment, please enter via the front door and sign him/her in the Sign In/Out booklet.

#### **Building Project Update**



The school community will be very busy during the first term, clearing out classrooms in order for the works to commence. This is a great chance to acknowledge Mrs Dyer for all of her efforts relating to the Building Project and I would also love to thank her for her support during the principal handover process.

#### **COVID Updates**

As you may have seen, the Department has a number of things in place to make the return to school as safe as possible. We have received 3 ventilators to run in each of the learning spaces.

Each student has received a packet of Rapid Antigen Tests. It is recommended that these tests be completed twice a week. We expect another delivery this week to last until the end of Week 4. If your child returns a positive RAT test, please contact the school so that the appropriate procedure can be followed.

We will also make the most of our lovely outdoor learning spaces and have received a grant from the Victorian Schools Building Authority to get another shade sail which will provide us with more space for outdoor learning when it is nice weather.

# In the Classrooms...




#### Seniors

#### **Vaccinations**

It's been really fantastic to see such excitement around the return to school and we want to keep it that way. A crucial part of that is getting as many students vaccinated as possible.

Alongside ventilation and other vital COVIDSafe steps such as regular rapid antigen testing, supporting as many students as possible to be vaccinated will help make our school as safe as possible.

Bookings for children aged 5 to 11 to receive the paediatric Pfizer vaccine are open and we encourage parents and carers to get your child vaccinated, if you haven't already done so.

The <u>Pfizer vaccine is safe and recommended for children</u>. The vaccine will help protect your child from getting sick from COVID-19, help to reduce the spread of COVID-19, and help ensure kids can have more time at school and playing with their friends.

Vaccinations for children aged 5-11 years old are delivered at 2 appointments, 8 weeks apart. Children with specific medical vulnerabilities can access their second dose 3 weeks after their first dose.

## INFORMATION FOR FAMILIES

This information is about students attending school. It is for their families and carers.

#### **EVERY DAY COUNTS**

You and your child are an important part of your school's community.

Students will be returning to face-to-face learning in Term 1 and great things will be happening at your child's school this year.

We are so excited to have your child in the classroom, where they can receive the support that they need to succeed and have a happy experience at school this year.

Every day of attending school counts. Being at school supports your child's learning, social and mental wellbeing.

#### Supporting our students

Schools will be making sure classrooms are as safe as possible for students and will be monitoring their mental, physical and social wellbeing.

Your child's school will support students who need to catch up. Teachers will work with students to understand who may need extra learning support. Some students may be offered tutoring or other assistance to ensure that they are able to participate and enjoy their lessons.

Schools also have programs and staff who can respond to a range of student health and wellbeing needs.

If you have any questions or concerns about your child, you can contact your child's teacher or school principal, and you can talk with them about how the school can support your child.

#### **Providing a COVID Safe environment**

Your child's school is operating in a COVIDSafe way. Schools will make sure that staff and students wear masks, stay home when unwell, and physical distance when appropriate.

Schools will provide free, regular COVID rapid antigen testing for students to help keep them safe.

There will be voluntary rapid antigen testing in place for the first four weeks of Term 1 2022. The Victorian Government will deliver more than 14 million rapid antigen tests to schools and early childhood education and care services.

Your child's school will let you know if there has been a positive COVID case at school and what you need to do.

#### Helping keep your school community safe

Everybody has an important role to play. Mask wearing, hand washing and having your child vaccinated are all very important. All children aged 5 years and over can receive a vaccination and help to protect their family, friends and school community.

If your child is unwell, or has symptoms, keep them at home and notify your school.

Be prepared and know how to support your child's return to school.
