Thunderstorm Asthma Season

There is an increased risk of seasonal asthma, hay fever and epidemic thunderstorm asthma during seasons with increased grass pollen levels. This typically occurs between October and December.

<u>Epidemic thunderstorm asthma</u> events are triggered by a combination of higher grass pollen levels and a certain type of thunderstorm. People with a history of asthma, undiagnosed asthma or hay fever are at an increased risk under these conditions.

This risk is increased further for people who have poorly treated hay fever and asthma.

The best way to reduce and prevent symptoms of asthma or hay fever and reduce unnecessary absences from school is to follow an up-to-date asthma action plan or hay fever treatment plan, provided by a general practitioner (GP) or specialist.

Removal of Size 5 from Size Range

We would like to inform you of the removal of a size 5 from our size range. Garments previously labelled as a size 5 will now be a size 4, if there was a size 4 in the same range, it will now be a size 2. There are no alterations to the size specifications or the general fit of the garment, only an adjustment to the size number the item is labelled as.

Please be aware, this is Beleza sizing only and does not correlate with standard sizing from other companies. We would recommend families come into store to try on uniform items for the best idea of sizing. Customers can also ask our store staff for assistance in reviewing their purchase history and guidance on the best size.
